Steps to Complete Job	Hazards	Preventive Measures		
Using the lift gate to load and unload materials and equipment.	Caught between, runaway loads, trip hazards, fall hazards.	 Perform a visual inspection prior to use each day checking for loose, missing or worn parts and leaking fluids. Lift gate operators should not perform any maintenance. Repairs and maintenance should be performed by an authorized service technician. Never enter the area beneath a raised lift gate. 		
		4) Ensure proper hand/foot placement. Always be aware of pinch points.
