## Recognizing Hazards:

One purpose of Pre-Task Planning is recognizing potential hazards. Knowing what we're up against is where we start when we're planning our work. Here are a few reminders of hazards to look for.

- What could cause a slip, trip, or fall?
  - Water or Ice on the floor.
  - Cords or hoses across pathways.
  - Open holes.
  - Loose material or rolling stock.
  - Unguarded or poorly marked edges.
  - Debris or trash.
  - Tools left on the floor.
  
- What could we get caught on or cut by?
  - Sharp edges on stacked material.
  - Knock outs in metal studs.
  - Cut off pieces of studs.
  - Hanging wires that could poke or catch an eye or ear.
  - Expanded metal.
  - Discarded blades.
  - Trash piles and debris in dumpsters.
  
- What electrical hazards could get us?
  - Electrical cords with breaks in their sheathing
  - Cords running over sharp edges.
  - Conduits or stub ups that may not be flagged.
  - Poorly lit work areas.

What we're asking for is consistent or increased awareness of hazards around our job sites and being proactive in eliminating or mitigating them.
