perform elevated work.	to be exposed to strains, sprains, falls, and falling object hazards.	1) Additional PPE: Gasketed safety glasses, or a clear face shield in addition to safety glasses is required when overhead work creates debris.  Overhead work is defined as any activity above the shoulders. (See JHA #34)  2) The scaffold must be visually inspected daily by a competent person before first use, it must be signed off and posted at the access point.  3) Scaffolds must be tagged appropriately:  a) Green tag – No restrictions  b) Yellow tag – Restrictions listed i.e., fall protection required.  c) Red tag – Do not use  4) Users must be current on certification (every 4 years) to from a scaffold system.  5) Always keep feet on the work platform, never stand on the toe boards.  6) If using a ladder to access the scaffold, always maintain 3 points of contact. Do not carry tools or material in your hands while climbing up or down the ladder.  7) For material stocking, use mechanical means whenever feasible.  8) When moving material on a scaffold, get help
