This JHA is for the safe completion of Move-in/ Move-out (MIMO), loading, transporting, and unloading of materials and equipment. Special emphasis is placed on ergonomics, keeping body parts out of pinch point areas, and avoiding crush hazards.

Loading trucks.	Worker can be exposed to strains, sprains, pinch points, caught between, struck-by hazards, runaway	1) Plan your move path and clear all obstructions.		
		2) Use proper hand and foot placement to avoid		
		pinch points or caught between hazards.		
		3) Only workers that are current (within 3 years)
